<u>Guidelines</u>

- Article length: 500-700 words
- Key focus: one specific theme/topic for ease of understanding
- Useful tips:
 - ✓ narrate and tell story
 - ✓ be brief and to the point (i.e. follow the 'KISS' principle: Keep It Short and Simple)
 - ✓ utilize headers/subheaders to quickly highlight main points
 - ✓ use specific examples, evidence, details for support
 - ✓ use quotes, data, and visuals (i.e. maps, figures, graphs, photos etc. please include short description and source reference/photographer name)
 - ✓ share and link relevant document(s) (e.g. presentation slides, working papers)
- S <u>Avoid:</u>
 - Lengthy and detailed information not to exceed the maximum of 700 words
 - Meeting or project summaries
 - Long lists of activities
 - Multiple topics/themes and incoherent structure
