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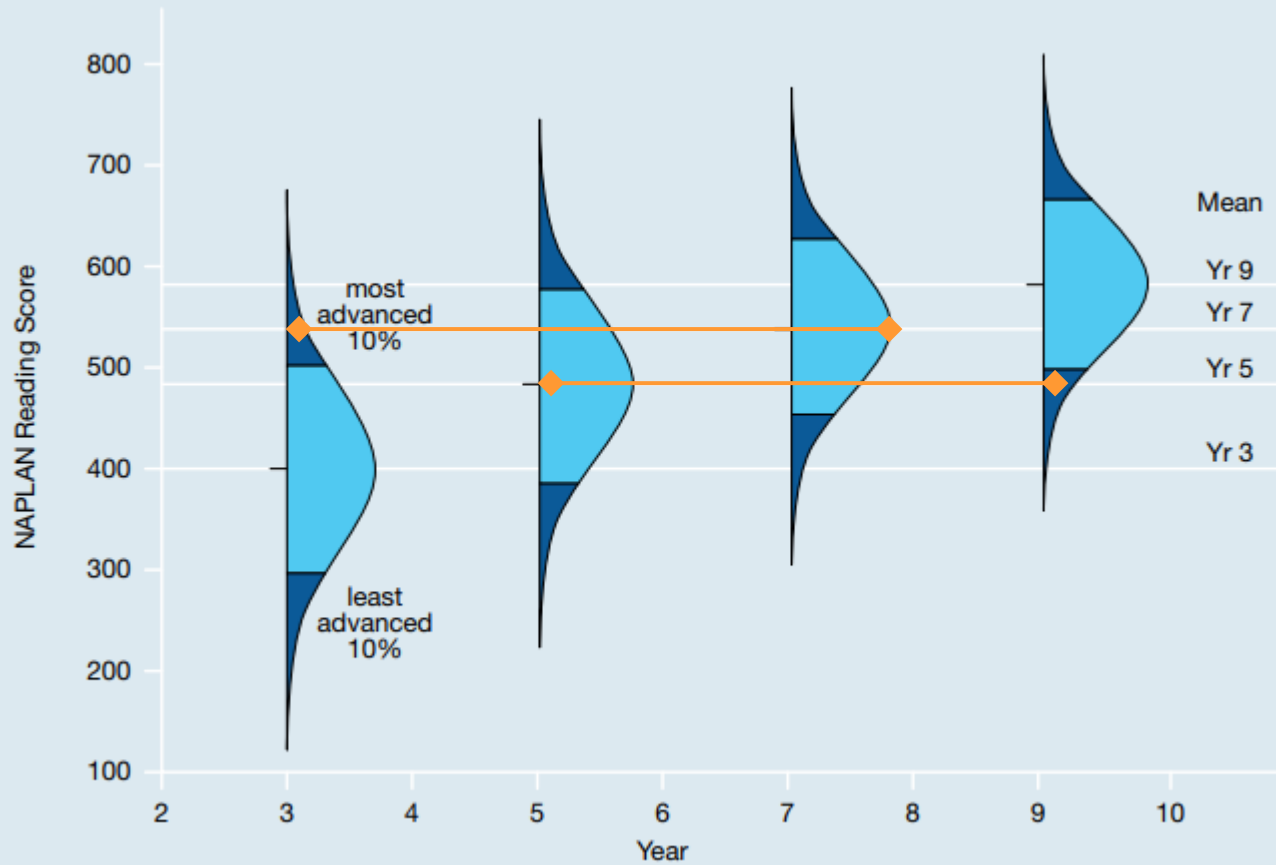

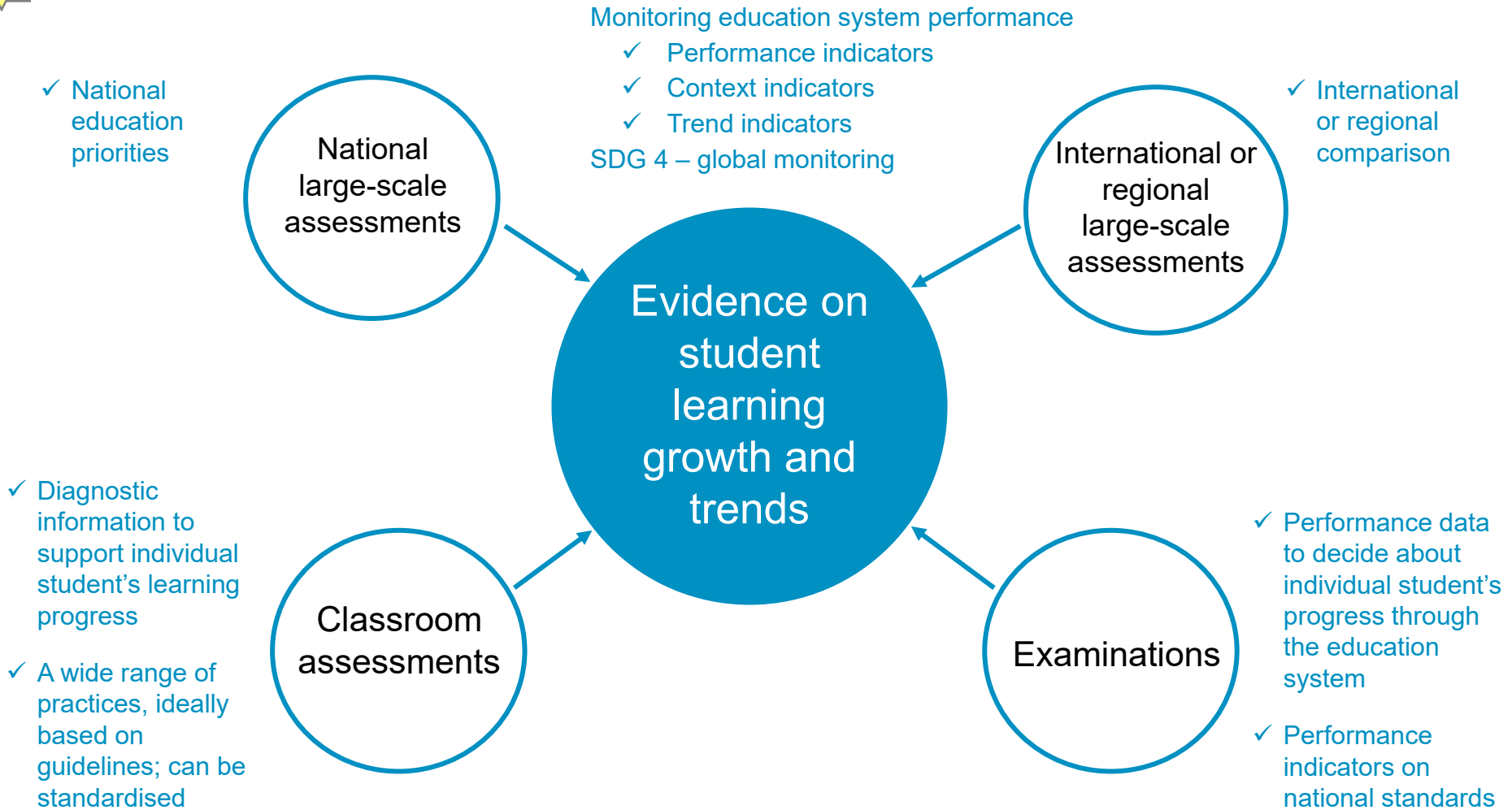

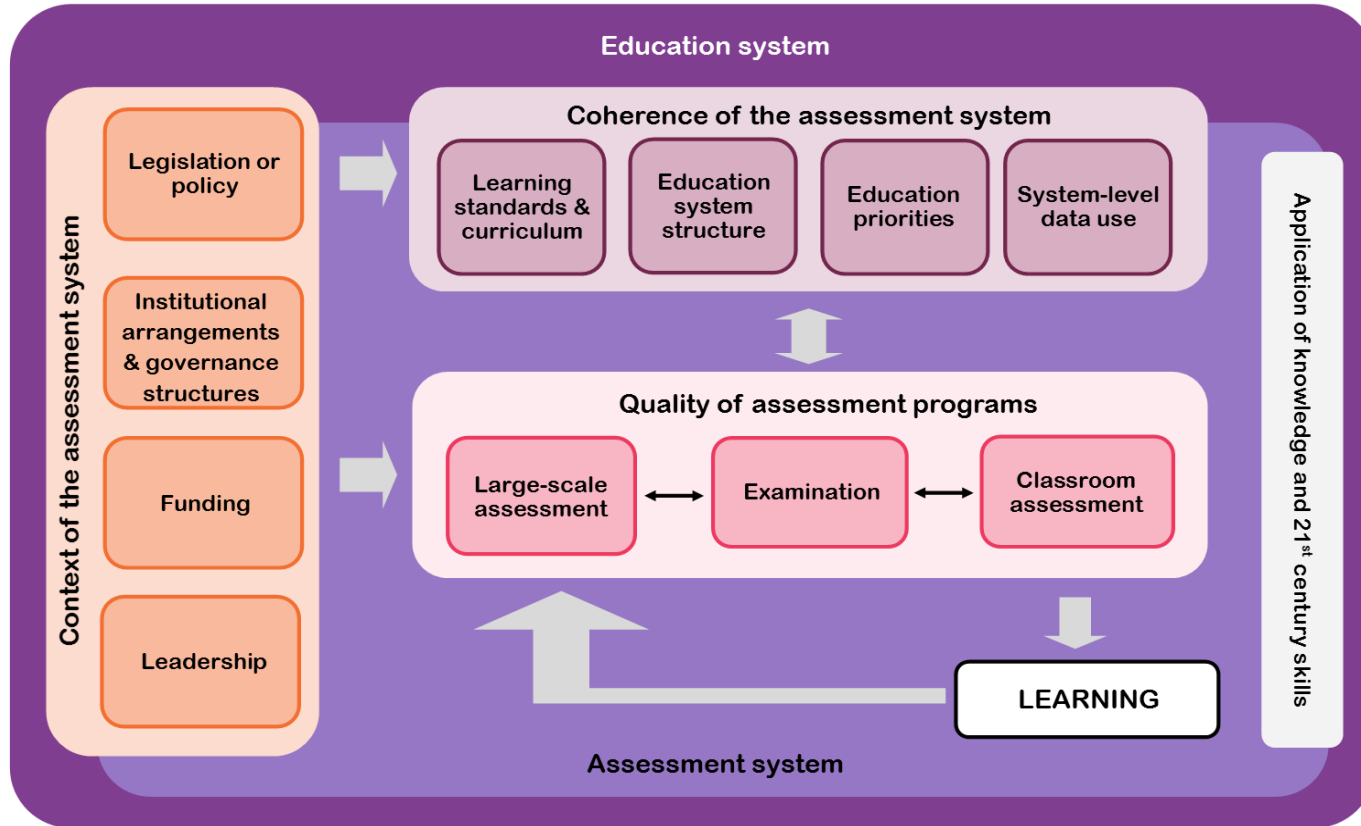
National learning assessment systems create a powerful evidence base on student learning growth and trends for education policymaking and practice.
